Innovation in international digital education: Is it desirable, feasible, and viable?

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Abstract

Innovation seems to be omnipresent, yet hard to grasp. At the beginning of the second day of UNED's Research and Teaching Innovation Conference, this talk aims to provide a shared understanding of "innovation" applied to international digital education projects. We will look at innovation through the lenses of desirability, feasibility, and viability asking the following questions:

desirability - Are we solving a relevant problem in digital education? *feasibility* - Do we have the resources and skills to tackle the issue? *viability* - Is it the right strategic move - with particular focus on international contexts?

Considering the role of international collaboration for innovation, we will elaborate on the importance of strategic networking amongst digital education practitioners while raising awareness amongst policymakers on how to establish an enabling framework for building an innovation ecosystem.
